to this month?



After their brilliant first sessions around the fire to cook marshmallows in the springtime, Reception children were able to recall all of the safety equipment and fire square rules needed in order to toast bread safely over the Forest School fire.



Year 1 have been preparing, lighting and managing a fire to grill their tasty chocolate filled bananas.



By removing oxygen from the 'fire triangle', Year 2 have been making charcoal using sticks of willow and heat from the fire. The children then drew Aboriginal artwork using the charcoal and other natural pigments found within the forest.
