FOREST SCHOOL





Reception children have been very excited this month because it was their first time at Forest School. They played games to help learn the Forest School rules, explored the woods to discover all the red ribbons, and they even had to help Oakley and Hazel Bear find all of their bear clothing.





'We all went on a bug hunt' with Year 1 and 2, finding lots of different creepy, crawly, slippery creatures hiding in our Forest School site. All of the children were super brave and held the minibeasts in their bug pots and hands. Year 3 and 4 became Vikings up in the forest. They learnt about typical Viking life and what they would eat. The children had to work together to prepare, light and manage a fire to allow them to cook tasty seasonal vegetable soup.



Splitting the children into three equal groups, Year 5 and 6 children were tasked to build a waffle lay and nest in order to light their fire. Once lit, the children took it in turns to feed the fire safely and cook scrumptious cheesy pizza wraps.

The children and staff raised £300 for this charity!




WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY

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SPORTS SECTION

Netball Impact Day

Year 3 and 5 children enjoyed a day of netball on Monday 16th October. This was a great opportunity for all children to be actively involved in netball and for some to get excited about potentially joining the school netball club.

Lessons started with a listening and reaction warm up before moving on to passing practices. Children discussed the importance of passing in netball and the different types that can be used. Children then moved on to practicing passing in pairs, focussing on the 'chest pass' and 'shoulder pass' using 3 key coaching points.

- 1. 'W' hand shape on the ball
- 2. Step forward transferring weight from back foot to front foot
- 3. Follow through with arms pushing the ball forwards in the direction of the receiver Group pairs practice

Once children had mastered the chest pass, we moved on to a group passing practice to combined both the use of the chest and shoulder pass. Children quickly progressed in this and you could see a brilliant improvement.

All children were a pleasure to teach throughout the day and it was fantastic to see such a high level of involvement and enjoyment.

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


