FOREST SCHOOL



WHAT HAVE FOREST SCHOOL BEEN UP TO THIS MONTH?



Reception children have been learning about the life cycle of butterflies, talked about how butterflies have symmetrical wings, and made their own butterflies.



Year 1 and 2 have been learning about birds and how they build their nests. In pairs, children pretended to be birds and made their nests using natural materials. They then had to protect their eggs from predators and collect worms to feed their young.



Year 3 and 4 have been learning about the identification of birds. They then helped the Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB) by recording the different species and number of birds spotted in the Forest School.



Years 5 and 6 have been split into two groups - one group completed the RSPB Birdwatch around Forest School, while the other group used sheath knifes. The knife work group recapped and developed skills which they had learnt in previous lessons. They carefully tapered one end of their willow stick into a sharp point and then used their intricate 'thumb cut' technique to carve out the notch.







The children certainly enjoyed exploring nature during the season of Lent.




















RED NOSE DAY 2024

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK 2024

Children across the school thought about what matters to them.

They communicated their thoughts by creating spirals. In the centre they began with the things closest to them and their everyday lives and as the spiral grew so their thoughts grew out from their lives to larger matters in the wider world. There were many recurring things such as their families, pets and hobbies; the oceans and forests of the world and wildlife.

We also asked the children what matters to them at school and they said feeling safe, trusting adults, being happy, friends and peace and quiet.

For Children - Chill and Chat

In school, this half-term, we have introduced 'Chill and Chat' sessions. These are available every lunch time from 12.30-1pm and children can opt in themselves or be guided to them by an adult.

They aim to support children by offering a quieter space where they have easier access to conversation with an adult from school, should they wish to talk about anything that may be affecting their wellbeing - whether that is the busyness of the playground or difficulties with a friend.

SAFER INTERNET DAY 2024

On Tuesday 6th February, we celebrated Safer Internet Day throughout the school. This special celebration, which takes place in February each year, aims to raise awareness of a safer and better internet for all, especially for children and young people. The theme this year was 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'.

Year 2 had a look at a story called 'Hatch Me!' it told us all about how some online games could be played unfairly and make us feel upset, angry or frightened. We talked about how to stay safe and happy online and how to keep our information private. Then, we created some rules for how to play games safely. Our grown ups are always able to help us!

REFLECTIONS FROM KS2

- Today has helped me because I know that if something unusual happens when I'm gaming, then I know to tell an adult or someone I can trust.
- I know more about how the different icons try to make me do different things.
- Notification alerts and daily streaks are designed to make me want to stay on the game or on the internet for longer, or to spend money.
- "Get this today only lasts for one day!" makes you feel you have to buy it right now.
- I use to push every notification and now I know to be more careful and just push the 'x'. It's made me more aware of what to stay away from.



After discussing how we can access the internet and the many things we can do on it from day to day, Year 1 listened to the story of 'Mo and Jaz'.

In this interactive story, we meet
Mo and Jaz, two children who love
playing games online. When
something happens in their game
that makes them feel worried,
they realise they need to let an
adult know. We talked to one
another about how changes online
like this can make you feel and
that if we have that 'funny, uneasy
feeling' in our stomachs, it is time
to tell a responsible adult. We then
recorded which trusted adults we
would tell at home or in school
should we need to.

To celebrate Internet Safety Day, the children in Reception watched a video about Mo and Jax who were watching something online when the video suddenly changed and something a little bit scary came on.

We then talked about what we might do.

Who would we talk to?
What can we learn from this?








SCIENCE WEEK ANIMALS2U WORKSHOPS

During Science week, each class was visited by Marie from Animals2U South West. She taught us about groups of vertebrates and invertebrates, discussed the features of different animal groups and how they have adapted to their habitats.

Firstly, we were introduced to giant millipedes which are adapted to living in the rainforest as their brown colour camouflages them. We then saw how a white tree frog can climb because of its sticky feet pads. Next, we learnt how a bearded dragon defends itself from predators in the desert by puffing out its spikes and finally we observed some mice, discussing the features that all mammals have in common.























SPORTS SECTION

On Friday 8th March 2024, lots of girls joined a lunchtime football session up on our school field. This was part of national 'Let Girls Play Football' which coincides with International Women's Day. The girls really enjoyed having a kick about together and managed their own mini games. We have also been given a brand-new Girls Football kit from Premier League, attained through our partnership with Exeter City, to wear in friendly matches or tournaments. We think they are a great colour!

KNIGHTS, DRAGONS AND CASTLES

Crocodile and Koala classes had a 'ball' celebrating their topic Fabulous Finish! During the half term we have been learning about famous castles and their design features, also about knights and the different roles played within the castle walls. We had fun exploring stories about dragons and drawing then improving our own pictures of Zog! To celebrate the end of our topic we designed our own crowns and decorated goblets and biscuits – we then sat together to share and enjoy our banquet afternoon!

Crocodile and Koala classes enjoyed learning all about Chinese New Year. We learned about the traditional celebrations and the importance of the colour red in Chinese culture. We listened to the story of Chinese New Year, how the Jade Emperor set a race to determine the order of the 12 animals. In class we had a go at writing 'Happy New Year' in Chinese on our own golden fans and making red lanterns too. We ended the week with a 'Dragon Dance!' In class we decorated our own dragons to use in our performance and practised leading the dragon dance and playing musical instruments! We then performed our dances to the whole school during their playtimes we had a fantastic week celebrating and learning!


